Academics

- Georgia Gwinnett College is a dynamic learning community where faculty and student interaction and mentoring are the hallmark.
- The college has more than 40 concentrations in 12 majors, teacher education tracks and pre-health courses.

- Nearly all of the college's full-time faculty hold a Ph.D., Ed.D., or other professional terminal degree.

- GGC ranks among top 10 percent in the nation for active and collaborative learning [2010 NSSE study].
- Student Success Programs ensure that all GGC students, regardless of their academic preparation, have a comprehensive student support program to develop skills needed to succeed.
- Faculty mentors work closely with their students throughout their years at Georgia Gwinnett College.
- Faculty are available to students via cell phone for questions and academic assistance outside the office.
- First Year Matters supports students to develop skills and attitudes necessary for college and life success.
- Career Services available.

- Student Wellness Programs offered (counseling, health services, fitness center).

Technology

- Students are immersed in a high-level technology environment in every classroom.
- All classrooms feature "smart" technology. Teachers control many different tools while lecturing – the internet, media players and overhead digital projectors. A built-in recorder can capture the lecture and save it to a Web site or e-mail. Students have more options for acquiring, reviewing and retaining lecture content.
- Blackboard and other online tools give students access to class information, providing the flexibility to learn at home, in the classroom or in the office.



Student Life

- There are more than 60 registered clubs and organizations.
- A Fitness Center with a large gymnasium, swimming pool, game room, running track and training area with Nautilus equipment, free weights, treadmills, stationary bicycles and racquet ball courts.

Athletics

- GGC offers an integrated athletics program including intercollegiate, intramural and club sports.
- Intercollegiate Grizzly Athletics will begin in the fall of 2012, featuring men's baseball, men's soccer, men's tennis, women's soccer, women's softball and women's tennis.

Admissions

- Full-time and part-time students, first-year, transfer, non-traditional and dual enrollment students are welcome.
- As a member of the University System of Georgia, courses taken at GGC are easily transferrable to and from institutions within the state university system as well as most other higher education institutions.
- Campus tours are available Monday-Friday at 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. by appointment only and during Open House. Reserve your tour online at www.ggc.edu/visit.
- College Prep Diploma/ 2.0 GPA and Tech Prep Diploma/ 2.2 GPA.
- Beginning fall 2012 freshman applicants must meet the minimum score on one of three tests:
SAT 480 in critical reading, 460 in math
ACT 21 in English, 19 in math
COMPASS 32 in English, 62 in reading, 20 in math
- Freshmen and applicants with fewer than 30 transfer hours must request that their most recently-attended high school submit an official high school transcript to Georgia Gwinnett College.
- Applicants who have attended any college (as a transfer student or as a HOPE-ACCEL student) must request official college transcripts from all colleges previously attended. These official transcripts must be sent directly to GGC.
- Admissions counselors are available Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday 8 a.m.-5 p.m. and Wednesday 10 a.m.-5 p.m. No appointment necessary.

2011-2012 Tuition and Financial Aid

- Tuition at GGC is \$109.87 per credit hour up to \$1,648 per semester.
- Financial aid available includes the HOPE Scholarship and federal grants and loans (tuition, fees, books and living expenses)
