GGC conducted re-survey and mapping of old categories to meet the new reporting standards; GGC's revised data were able to be presented by new categories for that of Fall 2009 while the SER numbers, still derived from the pre-survey data, contain a large amount of missing information. Beginning in Summer 2010, the USG data collecting system was able to collect and publish the updated race/ethnicity information.
