Beginning in Summer 2010, USG data collecting system was able to collect and publish updated race/ethnicity information.

For IPEDS Full-time First-time Freshman (FTFTF) cohort, the USG Retention, Progression and Graduation (RPG) tracking employs a group of variables and conditions as used in identifying the First-time Freshman (FTF) students by the SER technical definition. However, the IPEDS definition is more inclusive as to who can be counted as FTF. For example, a student who was enrolled in the fall term and also matriculated as a first-time student in the preceding summer (with additional conditions attached) can be also counted as FTF in the Fall. Thus, the count of FTF by the IPEDS definition is greater than that by SER definition.
