Entrance exam requirements: Dental Admissions Test (DAT)

Applicants must have taken the DAT within three years of applying, limited to three attempts. The DAT must be taken by the September 30 deadline, 11 months before those accepted are due to enroll. http://www.ada.org/en/home-ada/education-careers/dental-admission-test

What factors are considered in the admission process for dental school students?

- 1. The completion of the prerequisites for the program. Preference is given to students who earn a baccalaureate degree.
- **2.** An overall minimum GPA of 2.8 (average GPAs: overall 3.62; science 3.56) is required (this includes all coursework that has been attempted except for health, PE, orientation and learning support courses).
- **3.** Quality of the admissions essay
- **4.** DAT Entrance exam scores (Only three attempts at the DAT are allowed)
- 5. Letters of recommendation
- **6.** The Committee considers other factors such as health care and research experiences, leadership, community service or programs, family responsibilities, national recognition, ethnic or cultural backgrounds and commitment to practice in Georgia or health care shortage areas.
- **7.** Georgia residence is no longer required for application for the Augusta University College of Dental Medicine. Since 2012, the program has been willing to accept up to 5-10 percent of its students from out of state. Be aware most state schools give preference to in-state residents.
